Michigan has a statewide sales tax rate of **6%**, which was introduced in 1933. This data sheet was last updated in November 2021 by SalesTaxHandbook.com.

What is exempt from sales taxes in Michigan?

Many states have special sales tax rates that apply to the purchase of certain types of goods, or fully exempt them from the sales tax altogether. Here's how Michigan taxes five types of commonly-exempted goods:

Are services subject to sales tax in Michigan?

"Goods" refers to the sale of tangible personal property, which are generally taxable. "Services" refers to the sale of labor or non-tangibles. In Michigan, specified services are taxable. To learn more, see salestaxhandbook.com/michigan/sales-tax-taxability#services.

Local Sales Taxes in Michigan

Municipal governments in Michigan are also allowed to collect a [local-option sales tax](#) that ranges from 0% to 0% across the state, with an average local tax of N/A (for a total of 6% when combined with the state sales tax). The maximum local tax rate allowed by Michigan law is N/A. Below are listed local sales tax rates for the five largest cities in Michigan.
