### Are services subject to sales tax in Michigan?

"Goods" refers to the sale of tangible personal property, which are generally taxable. "Services" refers to the sale of labor or non-tangibles. In Michigan, specified services are taxable. ### Local Sales Taxes in Michigan

Unlike many other states, Michigan doesn't allow municipal governments to collect a local option sales tax. Therefore, sales tax rates will be the same across the entire state.
